THE EXEMPLARY CHALLENGE 2018


In recent years, *The Exemplary* Challenges have included many elements of design, such as color, line, and shape. It has been exciting to see the varied ways we all responded to these basic design ideas, and wonderful

to see so many award-winning pieces, too.

This time, we'll have another "shape" challenge—but it will be a *specific* shape to tease your creative juices: **an angel!** NAN employs an angel as one of its icons, so this is a great opportunity to see what we can do with this theme.

She or he can be standing, sitting (on a cloud?), flying, or just floating by. She or he could be playing a trumpet or a harp, maybe holding a book or flowers. Our angel can be shown in profile, or full face, could be a cherub, or older and may or may not have wings and/or a halo. His/her garb should be angelic, but not necessarily, so keep that in mind. Use your imagination about colors and techniques, but remember to keep the embellishments under control!

Don't forget to include an artist statement about how your angel came to life and grew. Size: up to $11'' \times 14''$ —with a matte if necessary, framed with screw eyes and wire, and ready to hang. Of course, your angel could be made into any other item, such as a pillow or a tray, but still should be finished appropriately for that purpose.
