The Exemplary Challenge 2022

What stitches do you imagine when you see prickly pear cactus, little fuzzy animals, or rough tree bark? Trying to express them in embroidery can be challenging, but also fun. Therefore, our next challenge will be having fun with texture.

Texture draws attention to a composition, giving it depth and form. It can jump out, like fireworks, but not always. It can also be sensuous satin, a delicate fern, or wispy steam from a teacup. Before you dash off in a frenzy of French knots and turkey work, remember restraint, restraint. Texture can occur in different levels and some unusual ground fabrics might be used, such as silk, burlap, corduroy, or velvet. Think of the change in the feel and character of a concrete sidewalk compared to a bumpy gravel path, or a rocky garden.

Accept the challenge to express texture in embroidery no larger than $12" \times 16"$ following Entry Rules (pages 20-22) and enter your original piece in *The Exemplary*! Do not forget your Artist Statement about how your textural inspiration developed!
