401: Ginkgo with Plum Vase – Wendy Moore

Proficiency Level: Intermediate/Advanced Kit Cost: \$170 Ground: 12" x 16" Soft Mocha Congress Cloth Design Size: 7" x 11"

Ginko leaves, tumbling down between light and dark screens with a red Plum Vase waiting to be filled. A study between light and dark neutrals, golden leaves and red vase brings life and contrast to the neutrals, worked in overdyed silks, floss, floche, pearl cottons, and a touch of Silk Lamé braid. Leaves are stitched with composite stitches in over-dyed cottons and silks, giving the impression of growth and depicting the dappled nature of the leaf with just a hint of sparkle. The dark side panel is stitched in overlapping Gobelin motifs using an almost-black Mandarin floss to form the lattice. The Plum vase will be stitched in a Ming Stitch variation using shiny Neon Rays.

Student to Bring: 12" & 16" stretcher bars, tacks or staples, a laying tool, frame or frame weight, usual stitching supplies; light and magnification recommended. **Pre-work:** None

101: Debbie Revisited – Debbie Stiehler

Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: \$0 Ground: Painted Canvas or Counted Needlepoint Design Size: Varied

Bring an original design by Debbie or a canvas from a past *Interpreting the Painted Canvas* workshop with a stitch guide by Debbie. Come stitch in a relaxed atmosphere with old and new friends. Refresh or learn new techniques by sharing with classmates.

Student to Bring: One of Debbie's original designs or a canvas from a past *Interpreting the Painted Canvas* workshop with a stitch guide by Debbie. **Pre-work:** None

102: Japanese Embroidery Study Group – Mary Alice Sinton

Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: Varies; to be purchased prior to class from instructor Ground: 100% Silk Fabric Design Size: N/A

All levels of Japanese Silk Embroidery and Japanese Bead Embroidery are taught including Phase pieces and Challenge pieces enhancing the student's journey into the way of Japanese Silk Embroidery. Exploring Japanese Embroidery (JE) helps a student improve their overall stitching in any medium with the discipline and structure found in this curriculum. Please allow a minimum of 6 weeks prior to class to order a Japanese Embroidery kit.

Student to Bring: JE supplies including awl, Tekobari, JE needles, scissors, magnification, light box. **Pre-work:** None



103: Country Garden Basket – Mendie Cannon Proficiency Level: Basic/Intermediate Kit Cost: \$129 Ground: Trigger Cloth Design Size: 5" x 7"

An elegant basket of flowers ready to sit on the guest book table of a lovely spring garden wedding. *Country Garden Basket* would be a lovely gift for someone's birthday, anniversary or wedding. You will learn the basic Brazilian Embroidery stitches while creating a design you will cherish. Stitches use 4 of the 8 weights of thread and include: stem, leaf, couching, bullion, cast-on, double cast-on, Hungarian braid, French or colonial knots, and pistil. Upon completion of this design

you will have the skill and knowledge to use these stitches to form the various flowers and leaves and you will be ready to work on more advanced Brazilian Embroidery designs.

Student to Bring: 8" or 10" hoop or 10" x 10" stretcher bars and tacks, light and magnification if needed. **Pre-work:** None

104: A Rose and Gold: A Study in Silk & Metal Thread -

Margaret Kinsey

Proficiency Level: Intermediate Kit Cost: \$80 Ground: Silk Design Size: 4 ½" x 4 ¼"

The red rose forms the center motif of this design. It is surrounded by gold leaves, acorns, and arabesque. The design itself is reminiscent of a motif from medieval architecture. The Rose outline padding is #5 red Japan metallic thread, with the final layer stitched with soie ovale. The gilt kid leaves are appliquéd with invisible stitches, then outlined with #7 check thread. Pearl purl forms the veins and stems, with check thread adding width to the outsides of the stems. The acorn's cup is padded with cotton thread and felt. The final layer on the acorn cup is smooth purl worked in a



vertical satin stitch. The acorn top has a felt padding and is overlaid with chips of bright check purl. The arabesque is worked in Japan thread, imitation gold, check thread, gold twist and check thread. The piece is worked on a silk fabric with a cotton backing fabric.

Student to Bring: 10" x 12" stretcher bars; tacks or staple gun with staples; laying tool; 6" clear ruler; silk, metal, and felt cutting scissors; tweezers with fine point; thimble; beeswax; and a velvet board or a chipping box. **Pre-work:** None



105: Project Runway: The Needlepoint Way – *Dawn Donnelly*

Proficiency Level: Intermediate/Advanced Kit Cost: \$65 Ground: 18-ct Mono Canvas Design Size: 6" x 8"

Inspired by the TV series *Project Runway*, the student is challenged to create a needlepoint piece based on one of the pictures they take while roaming Somerset Collection Mall. The student will design/create a line drawing of their idea, decide on colors, and select the stitches. We'll then visit a local shop to select threads and supplies. The twist for this class will be to include a piece of wire. The student will start stitching in class, then go home

and complete the piece, and enter it into NAN's exhibition, *The Exemplary*, the following year. The favorite of the entered pieces will be picked by those visiting the exhibition.

Student to Bring: 10" x 12" stretcher bars, tacks, phone capable of taking pictures, threads from your stash, laying tool, drawing pencils, colored pencils, paper scissors, scissors to cut wire, magnifier and light if needed, usual stitching supplies and stitch books.

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106: Zelda the Patchwork Zebra – Toni Gerdes Proficiency Level: Intermediate

Kit Cost: \$175 Ground: 18-ct White Mono Canvas Design Size: 11" x 9"

Zelda is an exuberant patchwork zebra with her stripes of many colors. She is the fourth in a series of patchwork animals; the first was *Elliot the Patchwork Elephant* followed by *Gertrude the Patchwork Giraffe* and *Larry the Patchwork Lion*. The jewel tone color palette makes *Zelda* exquisite. Her "false" eyelashes will have her flirting with you. Several Rainbow Gallery metallics, Caron threads, Straw Silk & Planet Earth Threads, along with beautiful beads will be used to create her captivating design. The stitches will include old favorites, as



well as a few surprises. The background will be a white-on-white diagonal pattern that emphasizes the design and enhances *Zelda's* whimsical personality.

Student to Bring: 15" x 13" stretcher bars and usual stitching supplies. **Pre-work:** None



107: Copper Diamond – Kathy Rees

Proficiency Level: Intermediate Kit Cost: \$120 Ground: 18-ct Mono Canvas Design Size: 3 ½" x 12"

An abstract geometric, *Copper Diamond* features a diamond of batik fabric appliqued to the canvas. A variety of stitches are used to produce movement and create diamond shapes within the design. Threads used include Gloriana silks, Vineyard Silks, DMC Pearl Cotton, ThreadworX overdyed threads, and assorted Rainbow Gallery threads. Compensation and placement of stitched areas will be discussed, and the student will be able to adapt the piece if they desire.

Student to Bring: 8" x 16" stretcher bars, tacks, laying tool, magnification/light if desired and usual stitching supplies. **Pre-work:** None

108: Studio Time – Do Andrew Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: None Ground: N/A Design Size: N/A



202: Japanese Embroidery Study Group – Mary Alice Sinton

Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: Varies; to be purchased prior to class from instructor Ground: 100% Silk Fabric Design Size: Varied

All levels of Japanese Silk Embroidery and Japanese Bead Embroidery are taught including Phase pieces and Challenge pieces enhancing the student's journey into the way of Japanese Silk Embroidery. Exploring Japanese Embroidery (JE) helps a student improve their overall stitching in any medium with the discipline and structure found in this discipline. Please allow a minimum of



6 weeks prior to class to order a Japanese Embroidery kit.

Student to Bring: JE supplies, including awl, Tekobari, JE needles, scissors, magnification, light box. **Pre-work:** None



203: Four Seasons – *Mendie Cannon* Proficiency Level: Basic/Intermediate Kit Cost: \$142 Ground: Trigger Cloth Design Size: 8" x 8"

All the seasons are represented in one design. No need to change décor for the right seasonal piece as all are provided: Poinsettia for winter, Mum for fall, Zinnia for summer and Cherry Blossoms for spring. This design is destined to become a favorite and maybe even a family heirloom. Stitch it for yourself or friends or family members. Finish as a framed piece, a box top or however you can imagine it – maybe the top of your sewing box.


Student to Bring: 10" x 10" stretcher bars. **Pre-work:** None

204: Flame Sampler – Margaret Kinsey

Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: \$85 Ground: Ro Design Size: 6" x 7 3/4 "

Navy and rose are the main colors in this sampler, with accents of gold and pale yellows. This project uses silk, brocade and gold metallic threads. The silks are navy, peach, light yellow and gold. The stitches employed are *ichi dan* straight, line, *ni dan* straight, *ni dan* step, and *san dan*. There are three stitched patterns: flame, diamond, and *ni dan* step.

Student to Bring: Needle threader for fine and tapestry needles, scissors for cutting silks and another pair for cutting metal thread, a thimble, beeswax, light and magnification if needed. **Pre-work:** None





205: Flowering Maple – Celeste Chalasani Proficiency Level: Intermediate Prerequisites: Experience with surface embroidery including Long and Short stitch Kit Cost: \$70 Ground: Silk Shantung Design Size: 5" x 4"

Small lantern-like flowers dangle delicately in this Contemporary Stumpwork design. Large green leaves provide a vibrant background for the festive pink flowers. You'll use intermediate techniques including padding and wired slips to create this tropical themed design. Your kit includes silk shantung and cotton fabric,

stranded cotton and silk threads, felt for padding, 33-gauge wire, and needles. Left-handed instructions available upon request.

Student to Bring: 12" x 12" Evertite frames or stretcher bars, one 4" embroidery hoop, wire cutters, 6" ruler with English and metric markings, artist or masking tape, mechanical pencil, small sharp scissors, paper cutting scissors, cream colored sewing thread, fine needle threader, and usual stitching supplies. Magnification and good lighting are highly recommended. Optional: a doodle cloth to practice stitches. **Pre-work:** Students will transfer the design to their background fabric.



206: Night on the Town – Jennifer Riefenberg Proficiency Level: Intermediate Kit Cost: \$90 Ground: 18-ct Mono Canvas Design Size: 6" x 6"

This design is one of a new series of charted designs, celebrating and modifying the traditional samplers. The kit contains a variety of threads including metallics, cotton, silks, and wool. *Night on the Town* dresses it up in a dramatic and elegant design that feels like a special event – come on out and enjoy the glittering evening! Learn some new stitches and apply them to the areas of a design for better effect. Also, learn about value in a design.

Student to Bring: 10" stretcher bars and usual stitching supplies.

Pre-work: None

207: Rustling Leaves – Kathy Rees Proficiency Level: Intermediate Kit Cost: \$120 Ground: 18-ct Mono Canvas Design Size: 4" x 12"

The days are getting shorter, there's a chill in the air, and the leaves are falling. It's a perfect day for a walk in the park! Layers



of threads and stitches create the areas above and below the center ribbon of leaves and stones created with beaded embroidery and embellishments. Students will be given instructions to reproduce my beaded design area but will also be encouraged to put their own spin on it. Kits will include a package of beads and embellishments.

Student to Bring: 8" x 16" stretcher bars, tacks, laying tool, magnification/light if desired, and usual stitching supplies. **Pre-work:** None

208: Studio Time – Diane Herrmann Proficiency Level: All Kit Cost: None Ground: N/A Design Size: N/A
